

INTERNATIONAL INTERN CONTRIBUTION SCHEME

Effective February 1, 2012

Beginning in February 2012, JRP will implement an *International Intern Contribution Scheme* to strengthen JRP's overall internship programme and make it more equitable for Ugandan students.

Oftentimes, Ugandan students do not have the opportunity to gain practical experience in their fields before graduation like their international counterparts. This is largely due to lack of funding from their universities and families. Moreover, because they lack financial resources and equipment like computers, hosting national interns can put a strain on small organizations like JRP which only have a budget for core staff. Every term we receive dozens of internship requests from national students that we are unable to accept because we do not have the infrastructure to support them.

In order to provide more and better internship opportunities to Ugandan students and make our internship programme more equitable, we request our international interns to 'give back' by contributing to the costs of hosting a national intern. Funds collected through this scheme will be used to facilitate national interns when needed and to purchase laptops and other equipment to be used by future interns.

We request the following contribution to be made by accepted international interns before commencement of their internship:
